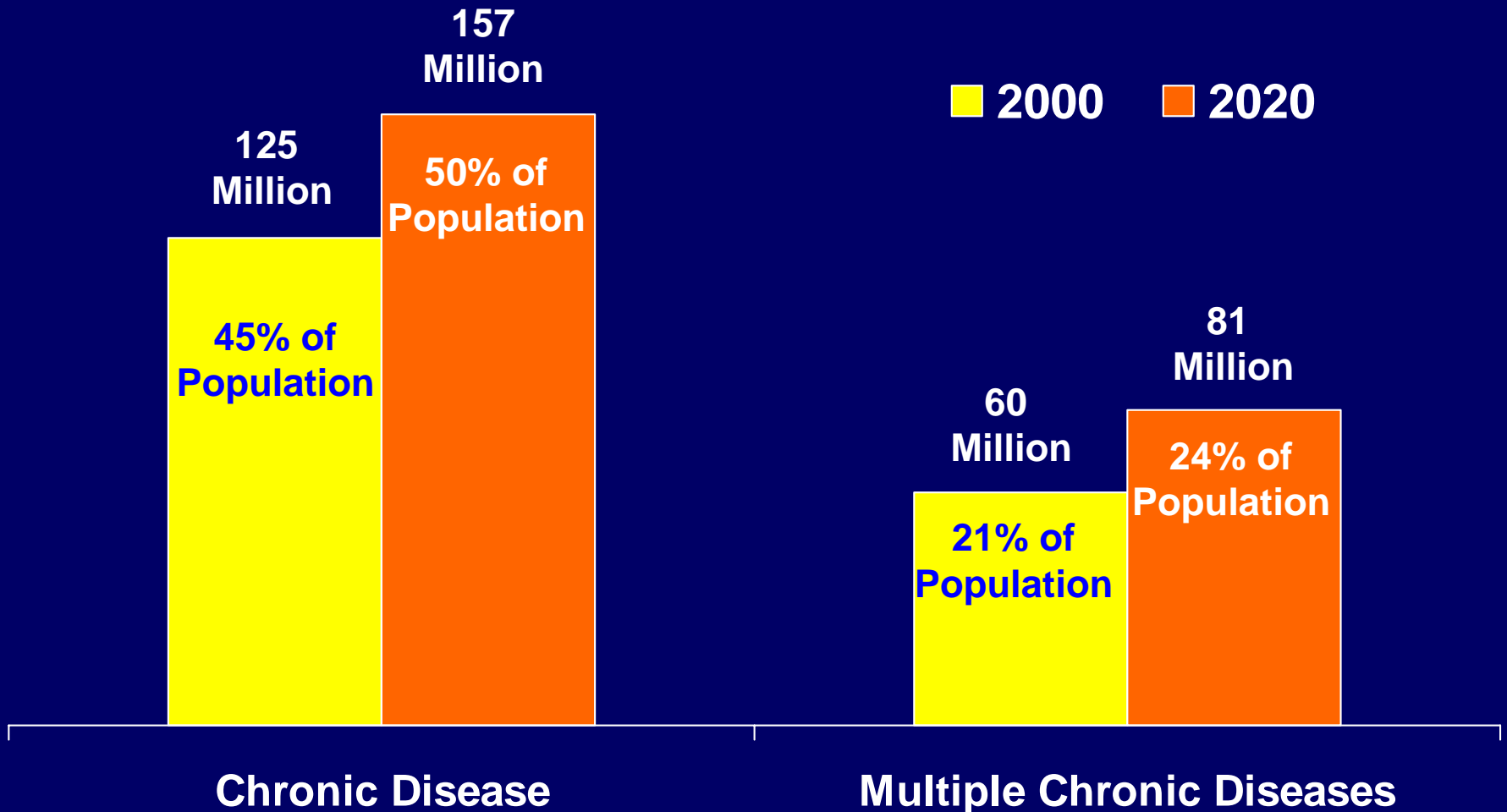
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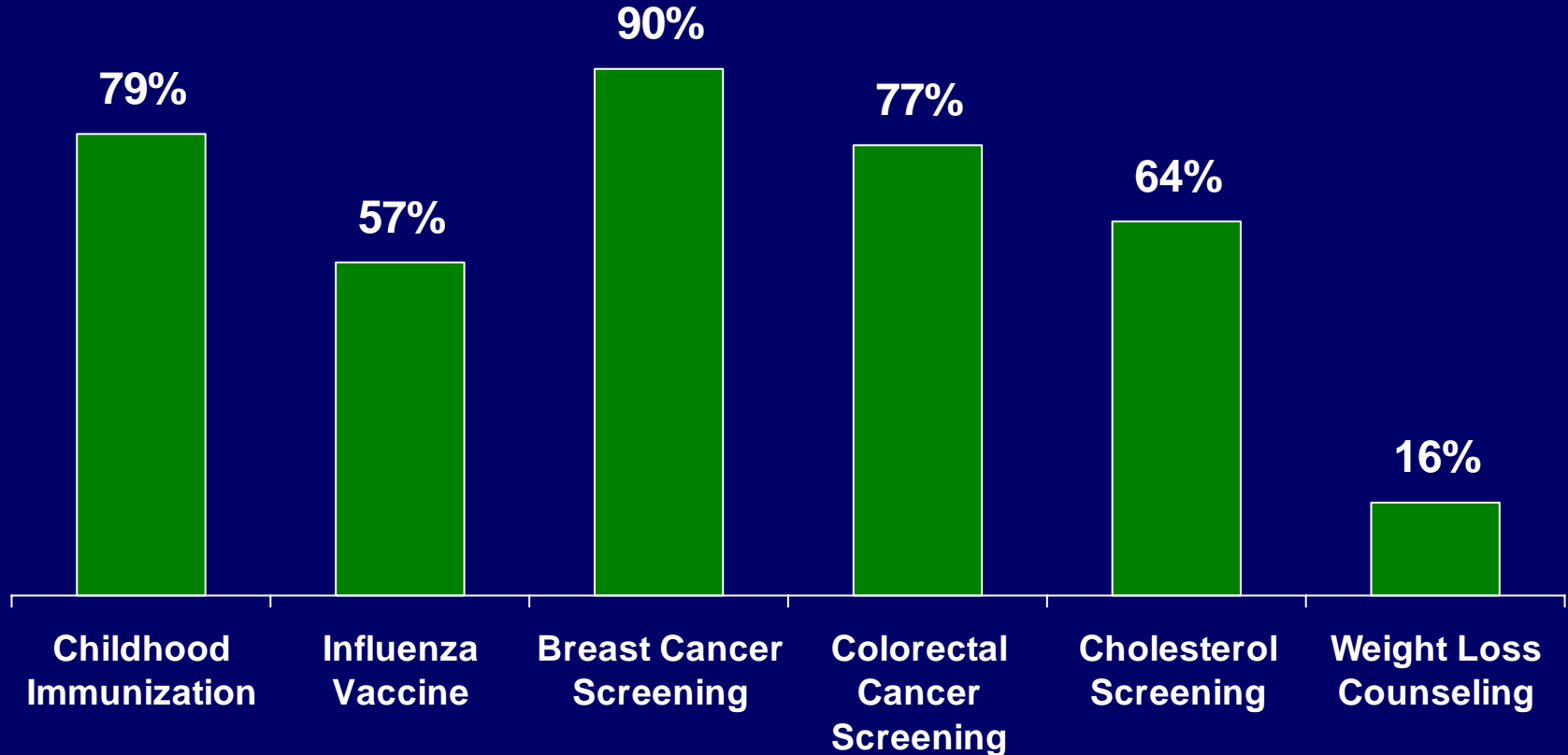

Projected Prevalence of Chronic Disease

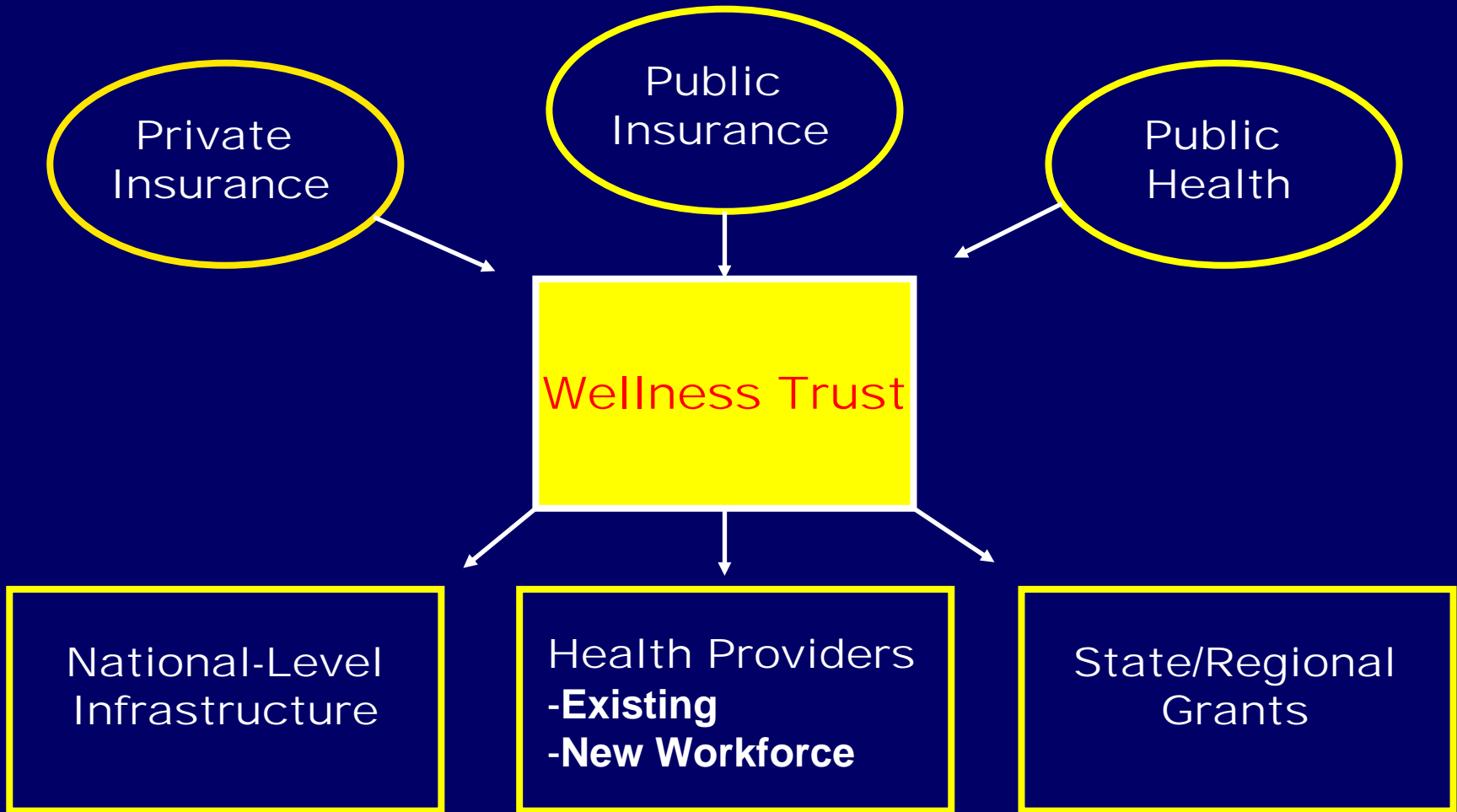


Insurance Coverage of Preventive Services

Structure of the Wellness Trust

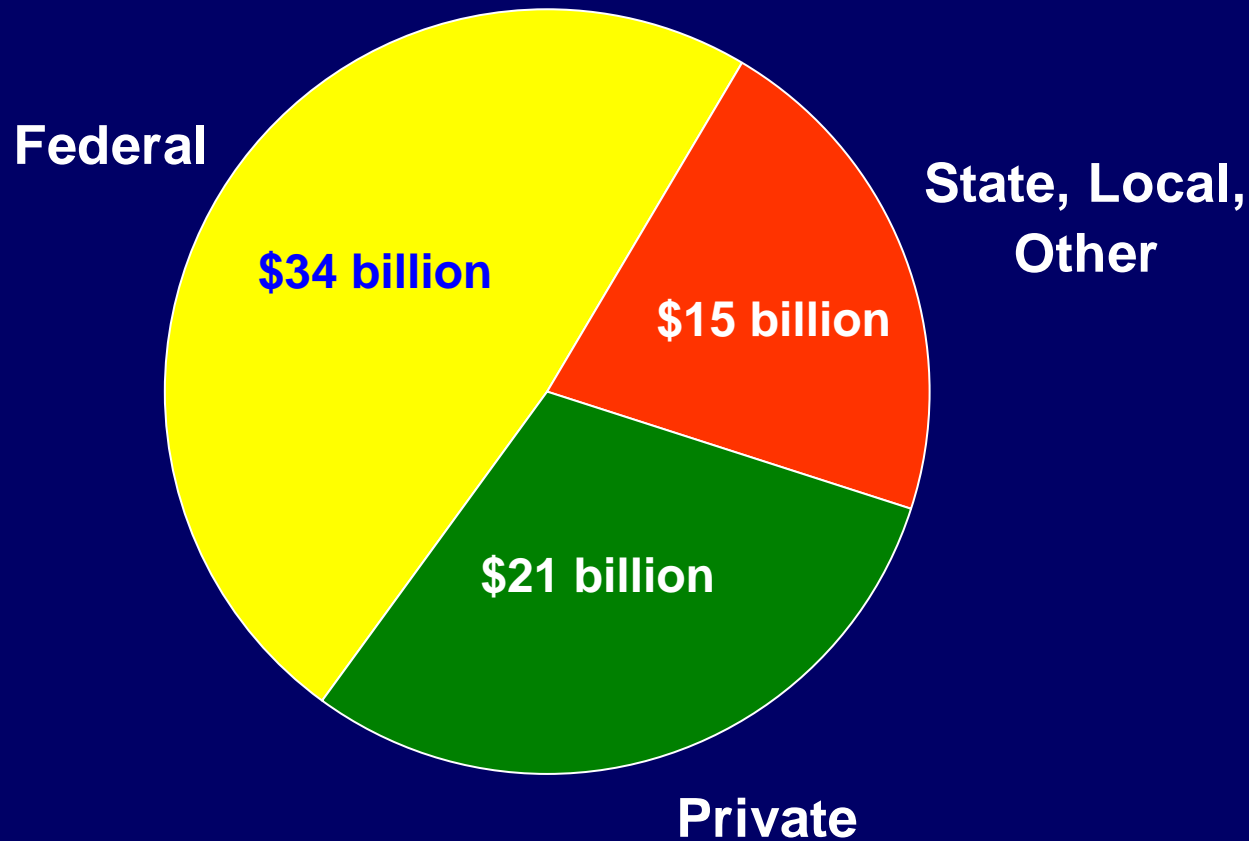
